Safety Matters

After the Annual Match a few folks brought some issues to my attention.

I know we run a relaxed match, but safety isn't going to be compromised in the process. I want the folks that come to the Grove to feel at home, comfortable and leave with the feeling that they are welcome to come back again and again. But observing poor gun handling or getting swept by a cross-draw shooter, they may think twice. We all know that when transporting your long guns, the muzzles HAVE to be up. When you're drawing and holstering from a cross-draw rig, you

have to do the dance or at least start the stage with the cross-draw hip forward so the muzzle of the pistol being drawn doesn't cross the 170 degree plain.

The Loading and unloading tables must be manned at all times.

Spotters should watch each shooter and call it as you see it, not just go along with the other spotters. The benefit of the doubt goes to the shooter. You're not helping anyone if you saw two misses, but see another spotter holding up three misses. Call it as YOU see it.
